2. Include an unofficial transcript inclusive of your fall semester final grades.
3. Ask two university instructors and one other person of your choice (high school teacher, headmaster, counselor, minister, employer, supervisor, club sponsor, etc.) to submit a letter of reference on your behalf.
 - ✓ Letters must be submitted on letterhead, contain an original signature, and be submitted in a sealed and signed envelope WITH the application packet.
4. Collect 10 reference signatures from peers/classmates willing to attest to your academic honorability.
5. Remember to provide ALL the required information when submitting your application.
 - ✓ Completed application packet
 - ✓ Unofficial transcript
 - ✓ Three letters of recommendation
 - ✓ Completed peer reference petition form
6. The COMPLETED, PRINTED, SIGNED application is due by 4:45, January 18, 2019.
