These students must have a minimum of a 3.0 GPA.**

____ **Summer Bridge - (By invitation only)** students who are conditionally admitted to Hampton University pending successful completion of this program. **Required to take two (2) courses (English and Math) and earn a 2.5 GPA by the end of the program. Must submit: Enrollment Form, \$500.00 Non-Refundable Deposit, and a complete Medical Form.**

Therefore, to accost, cajole, or proselytize students, faculty or staff, parents or others, to engage in gender and sexual harassment, use vile, obscene or abusive language or exhibit lewd behavior, to possess weapons such as knives or firearms, or to be involved in the possession, use, distribution of and sale of illegal drugs is strictly prohibited and is in direct violation of the Hampton University Code, on or off campus.
